Voters show their Confidence in the Parish Council...


What a turnout!

The recent Parish Council elections saw a significant number of residents engaging with and participating in a vote to select those Councillors they felt would represent the best interests of the community.

Across the whole of **Braintree District** the average turnout, where there were contested elections, was just **29%** – in **Great Maplestead** it was nearly double, a magnificent **57%**!

907 votes were cast in total by **175** parishioners – an average of **5** per voter – with each of the elected candidates getting between a **12%** to **15%** share – a real vote of confidence indeed.

The detailed results are shown below:



At the first meeting of the new **Council** on 15th May **Martin Elms** was elected Chairman and **Steve Harris** was elected Vice-Chairman.

Meet the new Councillors...

Simon Last is the new member of the Parish Council, replacing Dave Turner – who stood down after eight years as a Councillor to concentrate on his other interests.



Simon has lived at Barretts Hall for the last twenty-five years, during which time he has opened up his home for village fundraising events and worked on the Village Design Statement.

Since retiring two years ago he has actively sought a greater involvement in village life, joining the Task Force, maintaining a village green triangle and becoming treasurer of the Village Hall Committee.

Simon's skills and business experience make him a valuable addition to the **Council**'s strength.

Community Policing

Three of our new local Police Community Support Officers attended the Parish Assembly on 10th April to introduce themselves and to talk about their role.

It was agreed to object to the side extension on the grounds that it falls outside of the village envelope.
