More safety improvements on the roads and footpaths...

Seeing clearly now...

One of the main concerns reported to the Parish Council when it was undertaking the road safety review reported in the last issue was the danger to turning and though traffic at the junction of Gestingthorpe and Monks Lodge Roads caused by limited visibility.

In response, a **Task Force** working party was convened to clear the dense overgrowth around the pond on the western side of the junction.

The aim was to provide sightlines behind the oak tree on the corner apex so that road users either turning right into Gestingthorpe Road when leaving the village, or entering the village from Castle Hedingham, could safely check for oncoming traffic.

The before and after pictures below show the resulting improvements:



Better for walkers too...

 The fence beside FP23 (the one from Purls Hill to Hulls Mill), which had collapsed, blocking the path.



blocking the path, has now been reinstated.

- The loose planks on the footbridge in the Slype copse, which were making it unsafe to use, have also been reinstated and secured.
- The fallen tree which was blocking FP26 through the wood in the Slype has also been

cleared, so the path is now walkable once more.



Life's been draining recently...

...especially for the residents of Lucking Street during the protracted drainage work that was carried out in November!

Unfortunately the start of this long-awaited infrastructure project coincided with some of the worst rainfall in months, which helped put the work way over schedule.

Although the workers have now left the site, and the road is open once more, there is quite a bit of remedial work left to do – reinstatement of verges, re-alignment of kerbing and repairs to the Village Hall car park surface being just a few examples.

It is expected that this work will take place during week commencing 18th December. Updates to this schedule will be posted on the Council's website and Facebook page.

Don't Invite Crime this Christmas

Winter, with its dark nights and increased consumer activity, is a particularly lucrative time for criminals.

There are, though, common-sense precautions that you can take to help mitigate the threat and occurrence of seasonal crime:

- Do not leave shopping on display in your car.
- Try not to leave Christmas gifts on show in the house - it's an invite to steal.
- Do not leave gift boxes on display when re-cycling after Christmas – don't show anyone you may now have potentially desirable items indoors.



If you're going away, • make sure you advise your neighbours and use timer switches on lights so that your house looks occupied.

The village's Neighbourhood Watch scheme helps protect you and your property against criminal activity.

Application Received:

19/01829/FUL Land north of Purls Hill Farm, Purls Hill. Erection of agricultural building.

It was agreed to reiterate the **Council**'s previous objections to this application renewal, highlighting its concerns about the proposed change of use.
