# What a Load of Rubbish! – Littering Now a Big Concern...

# Picking Up The Pieces...

The **Task Force** undertook an early-season Litter Pick in late February, due to concerns about the accumulating volume of rubbish being noticed on verges and in hedgerows.



The clean-up operation netted a wheelie-bin full of landfill items, 5 sacks of re-cycleables and a tubful of bottles – by far the largest amount of rubbish collected in any recent litter-pick.

**Dynes Hall Road**, closely followed by **Monks Lodge Road**, were the worst areas for sheer volume of litter, with food wrappers and drinks cans being the main items recovered.

Unfortunately, just a couple of weeks later a further cache of cans and wrappers was discovered fly-tipped (right) near the **Hedingham/Alderford Farm Road** junction.



Nearby was a set of four worn car tyres, neatly stacked beside a hedge...

It is clear that localised dumping in such quantity is a deliberate act, rather than just casual thoughtlessness – so, to combat this unsavoury trend, a network of **Volunteer Observers** is being recruited to monitor and report fly-tipping and other littering activity across the Parish.

In the meantime, if you notice any suspicious activity locally, it would help if you could notify the **Parish Clerk** – in complete confidence; any information you can provide on cars/locations, perhaps with photo evidence of the litter, will be forwarded to the police for follow-up action.

# The standard penalty for a littering offence is £150, although persistent offenders can be fined up to $\pounds$ 2,500.

# **Field of Dreams**

The Parish Council have applied for funds to renew and replace some of the ageing and worn equipment/matting in the children's play area on the Village Playing Field.

At the same time consideration is being given to installing a new **Trim Trail**, for adult use, near the hedge-line at the rear of the field.

This will give parishioners the opportunity to stay fit and healthy without needing expensive, and sometimes under-used, gym membership.



The plans also allow for the provision of two new benches – one by the play area, another by the **Trim Trail** – and it has been suggested that parishioners may, either jointly or individually, wish to sponsor them as a community asset.

Artist's impressions of the proposed **Trim Trail** and new equipment will be on display at the **Parish Assembly**, when the **Council** will be consulting with residents and inviting comments.

# The Council's Taxing...

#### As a result of local Government funding cuts Braintree DC have had to raise Council Tax, after a number of years of zero increase.

The overall rise for 2016/17 is **3.8%** which, on a typical Band E property, equates to £71/year.



**Clir. John O'Reilly-Cicconi** indicated at the last **Parish Council** meeting that, even with this uplift, the 44% cut in Government subsidy means that **BDC** still needs to make £1.4m of additional savings.

## **Latest Planning Application News**

The Parish Council considered the following Applications at its last Meeting:

#### **Application Decisions:**

 15/01544/FUL & 15/01545/LBC Installation of 16 photovoltaic solar panels on outbuilding. Hosdens Farm, Hosdens Lane, Great Maplestead CO9 2QU.

#### Permitted 18/02/16

 15/01605/FUL Erection of a new exemplar, offgrid Passivhaus in south side of garden. Long Fen, Church Street, Great Maplestead CO9 2RJ. Withdrawn 10/02/16

The withdrawal of the **Long Fen** application followed a **Planning Committee** report that was critical of a number of aspects of the proposed development. #### **Applications Received:**

No **Planning Applications** were received prior to the last **Council** meeting.

However, a request has been received seeking appropriate **Parish** suggestions for naming the access to the recently approved development at *Highview* (formerly *Treeways*).

The developers have suggested the access road be called **Treeways**. The **Council**, however, consider that there are a number of alternative names that might be more appropriate – one suggestion being **Cracknell Close**.

It is proposed to solicit other suggestions from residents during the **Parish Assembly** in April before submitting a formal reply.

### **First-Aiders Required**

The Council's plan to enable the village to be able to provide an emergency response to local incidents requires the services of First-Aid volunteers.

Funding for **First-Aid training** and the purchase of a **First-Aid kit** is being sought, so the **Council** is currently looking for volunteers who would be prepared to undertake such training and act as first-responders to any incident.

No commitment is needed at this stage – just an expression of interest, preferably e-mailed to the **Parish Clerk.** 



As part of the overall emergency response plan, the Council is also considering the purchase of a **heart defibrillator**, in a secure cabinet. To this end, a community fundraising initiative is being formulated, which

will look to all parish organisations – School, Church, Village Hall, community groups – to help achieve this worthwhile objective.
