October seems a very empty month, it is some time since the schools resumed after the long summer break and despite the supermarkets trying to convince us otherwise – Christmas is a long way off. The events of the summer have passed, although some of you may be reading this before the Little Maplestead Flower Festival, if that is the case please do come and visit.

In the church calendar October is also an empty month. The church diary marks certain days as special. These the included the obvious days such as Easter and Christmas, but also the Sundays leading up to them. In October we have no such dates – all the Sunday's are called Proper – that is not special. Christians also mark days on which to remember particular saints. Here October only names three. On the 18th we remember St Luke, who wrote accounts of Jesus and the early church which are in the bible. Then on the 29th the names St Simon and St Jude appear, these two are linked as they were believed to have been martyred together.

Both St Simon and St Jude were among the 12 closest followers of Jesus, called the apostles. But of the twelve Jude is probably the lesser known. One reason for this was that in the early church many were thought to associate Jude with Judas. The latter being the disciple who betrayed Jesus. As the tradition grew up of praying to particular saints in times of difficulty Jude was left off any list. As a result he then became the saint who you prayed for in lost causes.


It is a reality today that for many that is what the church and God have become – places of last resort and lost causes. When all else has failed people may turn to prayer and possibly visit a church.

There is nothing wrong with that but there is another side to that picture in that God has not forgotten you – you are not a lost cause to him. In the same way Christians are reminded that they must not forget those in need, We will pray for our communities but Jesus reminded his follower that they needed to "feed the hungry, clothe those needing clothes etc..".

That is the mission of the church to serve the communities in which we live and the church is always looking at ways of doing this from prayer to action.

FACT: Most burglars will prefer to target the empty house unseen and avoid any confrontation.

As the days get shorter if you work away from home, or even pop out to get the children from school by the time you return home it may already be dark. A house in darkness says no one is in especially if your neighbour's houses either side have lights on and show other signs of being occupied. If you back onto open farmland or have parking areas or footpaths to side or rear this may be even more apparent.

Create the "Illusion of Occupancy", when its dark make your home look like you are in. Leave lights on or put them on timers or daylight sensors to come when it gets dark. Remember though no one lives in the hall or on the landing so if you leave these lights on supplement these with lights on in rooms that you would normally occupy at that time of day i.e. lounge and kitchen. A carefully placed imitation TV or "Fake TV" can further add to that illusion of occupancy by making it look like the television is on. Some burglars may also listen at windows or letterboxes for sign of activity, so consider leaving a radio on within your home.

Don't forget the outside of your property too, if burglars see that it is lit they are less likely to approach for fear of being seen.

Leave lights on, with energy efficient bulbs it costs very little nowadays and yet may save you lots!





If you're going out at night keep curtains or blinds drawn as dusk falls and lights on in the house with either a radio of TV on.


If you have CCTV please check that it is in full working order.
