There are VETS in Gestingthorpe!!! 01787 852850

No, we have not suddenly acquired a veterinary practice in Gestingtorpe! But we have been able to activate our new VETS system which supports the lone rescuer in an emergency situation - the Village Emergency Telephone System.

All too often a person finds him or herself on his/her own trying hard to help somebody and wishes that extra help could be on hand. Now that Gestingthorpe has its own VETS system extra help is possible, but it must be remembered that the **FIRST CALL is to 999** in any emergency situation.

Dialling 999 will give access either to the Ambulance Service, Fire or Police as necessary. Then, in the case of Ambulance, the caller will be able to remain on the line while being given spoken assistance as to how to proceed. If the defibrillator is appropriate and if there is another helper nearby he/she will be given the code number to open the cabinet and will be free to fetch the defibrillator. Alternatively, [01787] 852850 can be redialled. Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation is very tiring for one person to carry out for a prolonged period, so another helper is of the essence.

The defibrillator itself provides clear instructions on its use and determines whether or not it is necessary to apply a shock.

More Great Maplestead

Maplestead Magna Miglia

Sunday 22 July 2018

It was about 9.15am on (another) beautiful sunny morning when the eight vehicular contestants and their passengers congregated at Great Maplestead's Village Hall to take part in the first Maplestead Magna Miglia, otherwise known as a Navigational Scatter event. The vehicles ranged from a rather scary looking bright red Dodge Ram through to a beautiful 1964 Morris Minor 1000 convertible, along with a variety of Skodas, Fiestas and Kugas thrown in for good measure. There was a total of 25 brave souls taking part in what was promoted as a "mobile village guiz". This involved tracking down the answers to questions posed about various obvious and not so obvious land marks in four sections of an Ordnance Survey map which had Great Maplestead's village hall as its centre point, no landmark being further than five miles away from this





centre. Each section, which had to be navigated differently (e.g. using grid references, map reading skill etc), had seven questions but only twenty-one in all had to be answered, earning one point for each correct answer. The questions ranged from "What might smell "off" at this junction (Answer: Rotten End) to "What sort of mass might be held here" (Answer Bio).

And so after a breakfast of croissants and coffee together with a detailed briefing of what to do and how to navigate, the first four cars set off, one starting in each of the four sections, followed ten minutes later by the next four. The route was a total of 41 miles, estimated to take about two hours but of course there wide variations. One entrant who had to stop for petrol (!) travelled 55 miles but still managed to tie on points for second place whilst another, with a full petrol tank, managed 63 miles and was passed by a few entrants travelling in the wrong direction each time!! Dubbed Thelma and Louise, this team was the last one home, crossing the finishing line marked out by an unravelled loo roll, to wild applause from those who were waiting to start their BBQ lunch of burgers and sausages.




