A 'Stay Well This Winter' campaign was recently launched by Essex CC's Director of Public Health, Mike Gogarty and Cabinet Member for Health, Cllr Graham Butland.

This campaign is intended to:

- ensure that no one in Essex need suffer because of the cold this winter
- highlight ways in which people can keep themselves well at this time of year
- indicate how to obtain help and support in the local area for those at risk from the cold



As well as encouraging greater awareness about winter health, it is hoped that this campaign will

also help people realise the importance of ensuring their home is ready for winter and how to keep warm when temperatures drop.

## Steppin' Out...

The Parish's footpath network is currently fully open for walking, with just a couple of cross-field paths awaiting reinstatement.

The **Service Level Agreement** that the **Council** entered into this year with **Essex CC** – to receive funding for the **Parish's** maintenance of its own footpaths – has enabled **Task Force** volunteers regularly to keep on top of path overgrowth during the spring and summer.



It has also meant that repairs to footpath furniture, such as the broken **FP7** marker post by the steps at the bottom of **Church Field**, could be effected more quickly.

Work has recently been carried out to improve conditions on **FP26** at **The Slype**; 'stepping stones' have now been installed to help cross the boggy part of the path below the steps, after the plank bridge. These 'stepping stones' need to be treated with



care but walkers can now use this path without getting unduly wet or suffering muddy footwear.

## **Don't Invite Crime this Christmas**

## Winter, with its dark nights and increased consumer activity, is a particularly lucrative time for criminals.

There are, though, common-sense precautions that you can take to help mitigate the threat and occurrence of seasonal crime:

- Do not leave shopping on display in your car.
- Try not to leave Christmas gifts on show in the house it's an invite to steal.
- Do not leave gift boxes on display when recycling after Christmas – don't show anyone you may now have potentially desirable items indoors.



• If you're going away, make sure you advise your neighbours and use timer switches on lights so that your house looks occupied.

The village's **Neighbourhood Watch** scheme helps protect you and your property against criminal activity. It is also a source of security equipment, such as 'fake TV' lighting, to make your house look occupied during any absence.

#### **Latest Planning News**

The following Planning Application was received after the agenda deadline date for the Parish Council's last Meeting:

I6/01932/FUL Erection of a new, off-grid Passivhaus in the garden on the south side of Long Fen. Replaces Withdrawn Application 16/00804/FUL. Long Fen, Church Street.

This meant that this application could not be discussed as a business item. However, the **Council** was able to rely on its policy decision established on 25<sup>th</sup> Apr 2016 – "*that all proposed changes to the Village Development Boundary will be rejected*" – to respond accordingly.
