Essex Electric Vehicle Charge Point Strategy

The results of an assessment (assuming it has actually been carried out...) by EV Charger supplier **Qwello** – with whom **ECC** are currently partnered to deliver a number of charging points across the county – to assess the village as one of the locations for its current **On-Street Residential Charging Point Fund** project, are still awaited.

In the meantime, the Council has been contacted by another EV Charger supplier, **Believ**, with a proposal to supply and install a **fully funded EV rapid charger**, capable of charging two vehicles at a time, in the Playing Field car park.

Believ is funded by Liberty Global Ventures and Zouk Capital, which manages the Treasury-backed Charging Infrastructure Investment Fund, with support from its delivery partner Virgin Media O₂.

A site meeting with **Believ**'s Senior Public Sector Relationships Manager was held on 15th November to evaluate the car park's suitability for such an installation and discuss the proposal in more detail.

Their offer includes free planning and connection to the nearest suitable mains power source, installation of all the necessary equipment and signage and the long-term maintenance and operation of the charge point – there would apparently be no charge to the Council or any need for us to seek additional funding. In return, **Believ** would require us to sign an commercial NDA and grant a 20-year lease on the area within the car park required for their equipment (but **not** the parking space for the vehicles being charged), for which the Council would receive a monthly/annual rental.

A more detailed response from **Believ** is currently awaited, with the promise of a full proposal being available for us to consider at our January meeting.
