How to make the Hairy Caterpillar

You will need:

A piece of J cloth

Some Compost

Grass seeds

Rubber bands

What to do:

- 1. Sprinkle handful of grass in rough line onto middle of the cloth
- 2. Sprinkle some compost over the seed
- 3. Wrap the contents inside the cloth in a long sausage shape.

(like you would wrap a present)

- 4. Place rubber bands along the body to differentiate parts of the caterpillar body, (and to hold it in place)
- 5. Keep moist while you wait for the hair to grow.

6. Decorate to look like a hairy caterpillar.
