Community initiatives help deal with COVID-19 outbreak

Village Support Group

Parishioners have rallied round selflessly to support the Parish Council's request for action by the community to provide mutual support during the on-going coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak, particularly for the more vulnerable and older village residents.

A **Village Support Group**, co-ordinated by **Jacqui Mee**, has been set up to assist people who have either been affected by the virus or who are self-isolating voluntarily to help minimise its spread.

The **Support Group** also has a **Whatsapp** social media presence to enable concerns to be discussed and actioned more immediately – contact **Jacqui** for an invitation if you'd like to join.

The situation with regard to the development of the outbreak changes on an almost daily basis. The 'News' page of the Parish Council website – https://greatmaplesteadpc.co.uk/latest-news/ – is being updated with links to the latest Government Health Department and NHS advice as and when it is issued. Links are also being posted on the Maplestead Mates Facebook page.

While the duration of this outbreak remains uncertain, the **Council** urges everyone to follow the **Government Health Service** and **NHS** advice, even if it means short-term individual hardship.

Be sensible, stay safe and, most importantly, please let the Support Group know if you need help – don't wait to be asked!

Beware of fake news...

...especially some of the 'information' to be found on social media about COVID-19.

As well as being alarmist and, in some cases, dangerously inaccurate ('gargling with warm water helps prevent infection', for instance), there are also serious concerns that such fake news is being put out there for deliberately malicious purposes.

The saga of the Lucking St drains...

...drags on, as the work to reinstate verges and finish the channelling on the south side of the hill remains to be completed.

The road was closed periodically during February for a new drain to be installed and a conduit dug across the road into the drainage ditch opposite.





Later heavy rain proved that this new drain works well, doing its job in preventing water washing across the road by The Forge. The possibility of this water freezing and causing an accident was one of the reasons for the original drainage project.

Discussions are still ongoing with Essex Highways however as to when the rest of the work will be completed but, given the current situation, that may well be some time!

Parish Council Announcement

As a result, this will be the last Maplestead Magna Carta until normal business resumes.

Noise pollution is annoying...

...especially as the evenings get lighter and warmer and windows start being left open, allowing sounds from the radio, TV or even loud conversations to disturb self-isolating neighbours trying to enjoy their gardens.



Of course, it can also be the reverse, with sounds from outside affecting people who are self-isolating indoors, particularly if there is loud talking or music in the garden.

Excessive noise is the cause of most disagreements and arguments between neighbours, rows which can often be avoided by being forewarned about situations that can potentially cause annoyance and appreciating that, in most cases, the causes of many noise disputes are purely down to inconsideration.

Noise pollution is classed as a statutory nuisance and, under the provisions of the **Noise Act 1996** and other associated legislation, **Braintree District Council** has a mandatory obligation to deal with any noise which is deemed to be a nuisance.

However, if your neighbour's noise is causing you annoyance, an informal, calm call to them about your concerns is the preferable way of sorting things out.
