"NEXTDOOR" APP AND OTHER APPS.

This week someone very kindly popped though my door The Times dated Saturday 17th August with an article on "Nextdoor" App.

I am aware of this App of course and have on occasions been asked my opinion.

My view is that any communications to reduce the opportunity of crime is great whatever App is used. I do feel though that it is up to the individual to have such Apps which are appropriate for them.

However one thing I would say is that you must report crime to the Police either 999 (if an emergency and life threatening) or non emergency telephoning 101 or Do It Online before you actually enter information on any Apps even facebook.

As the information needs to be registered as "a crime" by the Police before it is "published".

Neighbourhood Watch Co-ordinators have their own databases/facebook groups to advise their local members of any suspicious activities of course but reporting a crime MUST be to the Police first! CBS
