This small white Citroen van has been cited many times in reports of scrap touting (sometimes for use in a "sculpture") over many months.

and Great Saxham 14:15hrs 13th November...

Suffolk Police say" We would like to speak to the driver."

Presumably the Police have been unable to find the driver at the registered address (a common occucurrence amongst vehicles used for criminal activity).

If you see the vehicle call 999 immediately (do not put yourself at risk).

MAN SENTENCED FOR SHOPLIFTING



BRAINTREE

A man who assaulted a police officer who caught him shoplifting in <u>Braintree</u> has been sentenced.

A man, 44, of no fixed abode pleaded guilty to two counts of shop theft and assaulting an emergency work after he was stopped in B&M on the 3rd October.

Detective Sergeant Gavin Tuck had been on a hotspot patrol of the town when he responded to a report of a shoplifter. He quickly apprehended the man inside the store, but the man attempted to escape and began to fight, grabbing D/Sgt Tuck by the throat. The man was then restrained and arrested.

He was sentenced to a 12-month Community Order with the requirement to attend 30 days of rehabilitation activity, and to enter drug rehabilitation with Open Road. He was also fined £80 and told to pay £100 compensation.

Essex Police say"In the 12 months to 31 October, our officers made 1,446 arrests for shop theft across Essex. During the same period, they solved 986 more shop theft offences compared with the previous year. D/Sgt Tuck was on patrol as part of Operation Guardian which seeks to reduce incidents of ASB, knife crime and violence through high-visibility foot patrols by uniformed officers in areas, and at times, that research shows incidents are most likely".

D/Sgt Tuck said: "The offender's actions were totally unacceptable. He was brazenly stealing from the store but I was in the right place at the right time to stop him, which shows the value of hotspot patrols. No police officer comes to work to be assaulted but once I'd got hold of him there was absolutely no chance he was getting away. Shoplifting feeds into other forms of criminality and we are working with retailers across Essex to target and arrest those responsible."

ABOUT CRIMESTOPPERS IN ESSEX

Crimestoppers is an independent charity which takes information about crime anonymously, online or by phone.

We don't take names or any identification, just listen to what you know and pass it on securely, 100% anonymously.

There's no police contact, no witness statements, no courts. Information is taken in more than 150 languages.

Online forms at www.crimestoppers-uk.org and calls on 0800 555 111 are untraceable.

Calls won't show on phone bills.

We're open 24/7, 365 days a year.

Crimestoppers passed over 7,500 crime reports to Essex police last year.

Nearly 5,000 reports about crime in the county were given to the independent charity during the first six months of this year – 1,000 more than the same period the previous year. The information about crime was given by 3,400 people - some gave information about more than one crime.

In September 498 people contacted Crimestoppers with information compared with 512 the previous September. All reports were sent securely to Essex police and other law enforcement agencies.

During the first six months of this year 4,905 individual crime reports were securely sent by Crimestoppers. Again, the highest number of reports were about drug manufacturing, trafficking and supply. More than 85 per cent of reports were given online These increases are again thanks to all partners who promote the services the charity offers to help keep communities safer.
