Cllr Harris Report/Action Plan – January 2023

Communications

1. Website/Facebook

Report/Review:

- The Council's website continues to be a valuable source of local information.
- Averaged across the whole of **2022**, unique visitors to the site were over **960** and it was visited just under **1455** times each month.
- As the chart below shows, after a slight decline in activity during 2021 following 6 years of successive growth in visitor numbers and site visits since the Council took control of the website, 2022 saw visitor and visit numbers back up to 2020 levels and page viewings at a pre-pandemic level:

- Some of the reasons for this may be that:
 - 1. A greater number of village events took place during 2022 than in the previous year; this in turn meant that there was more frequent updating of event information on the site, which is one of the main visitor attractors.
 - 2. Special pages created for the Cost of Living Support Group and the Queen's funeral were an additional source of interest and reference, as was the news about the Playing Field development and lottery win.
- The Council's Facebook page has continued to prove a valuable asset during the year, in particular its link with the village's Maplestead Mates page enabling important information to be quickly and widely distributed across the parish.
- Unfortunately, recent changes to Facebook mean that only information about the last 90 days activity can now be accessed. However, during the last 3 months, 15 separate posts were made on the Council's page, reaching 1999 people, each post reaching around 133 people on average.
- The top post by reach was the **Maple Lodge pond clearance** (**366**); the post with the least interest shown was the news about **Essex County Council's research** 'to explore the experience of individuals and households in the rural areas of Braintree district' (**61**).
- As would be expected, many more saw the Council's posts on the 490-member Maplestead Mates village Facebook group – there the same 15 posts reached 3276 people, with the top one being the Christmas Walk (354; 72%) and the lowest the ECC research (166; 34%).
- The demographic of the Council's Facebook followers is 71% women/21% men.

Action Plan:

- Regular updating of the website and associated links will continue in 2023.
- The Council's Facebook page will continue to carry links to the website when more in-depth information than can sensibly be carried on Facebook needs to be communicated, in order to bring it to the widest possible attention.


