

Great Maplestead Parish Council

Actions Undertaken – May 2019/April 2023

Playing Field:

- Traveller Incursion

 Successful negotiation and removal of travellers within 24 hours in June 2020 (working with key stakeholders, Essex County Council, Essex police and St Giles' School).

- Security Measures

 vertical wooden posts, a gate, security post and earth bund, seeded with wildflowers, installed to guard against traveller incursions

- Covid

- Put in place measures to prevent use of children's play area during lockdown, in line with government guidelines
- Car Park
 - \circ $\;$ Surface maintained to remove potholes and prevent flooding

Boules Court/additional Picnic Benches

- funded by a grant and installed to improve recreational amenities
- Play Area
 - waste bin repaired
- Terms of Use Notice
 - re-installed at car park entrance

- £110,000 Development Project

- initiated in March 2021, funded by local events and donations/the National Lottery Community Fund and completed in spring 2023
 - new field drainage installed
 - ageing playground equipment removed
 - new play equipment, meeting children's current play criteria, installed
 - recreational and social amenities improved
 - new pathway for school's Mile-a-Day programme and to improve access for people of all abilities constructed.

Footpaths:

- Water Meadows Footbridge 1
 - new bridge installed across brook on path to Reyes Hill
- Water Meadows Footbridge 2
 - \circ $\,$ defective planks replaced on bridge across brook on path to Lucking Street
- Slype Copse
 - loose/missing footbridge planks refitted/replaced
 - steps and stepping stones replaced by raised path to overcome difficulties crossing marshy ground
- Church Field Steps
 - $\circ \quad \text{risers repaired/replaced}$
- Hulls Mill Footpath
 - collapsed fence blocking path re-sited
 - o overhanging tree branches blocking path removed

- Dog Waste Bins

- two additional bins installed on popular walking routes (St Marys & Gestingthorpe Road), bringing Parish total to seven.
- Service Level Agreement with ECC
 - extended in order to continue access to County funding for the local undertaking of ongoing maintenance and repair tasks

Highways:

- Lucking Street Drainage Project

- initiated with ECC summer 2017
- completed October 2019
- o additional drain clearance work required in October 2021
- need for kerb channel repair
 - reported December 2021
 - rectified November 2022
- \circ more recent damage to kerbing awaiting inspection.

- Road Safety Programme/Signing

- initiated with ECC September 2019
- work undertaken and new signing installed March 2022
- 'Quiet Lane' proposal still awaiting budget/under review by ECC
- Litter Picks
 - zonal bi-monthly litter picks by volunteers introduced during Covid and now ongoing
 - sponsorship of 2 volunteers working for a Bronze Award on the Duke of Edinburgh's Award scheme
- Potholes

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• reports to ECC as and when necessary

Community Projects/Actions:

- Community/Emergency Information
 - website and leaflets regularly reviewed/updated
 - **Community Policing**
 - liaison established and regular contact with new PCSOs
- Defibrillator
 - stolen original replaced/improved security measures undertaken
 - CPR/Defibrillator Training
 - 2 refresher courses organised/held

- Parish Assembly

- held annually each April (2020 cancelled due to Covid/2021 held on Zoom) to provide a platform for first-hand reporting of information from and about various village institutions and the organisers of social activities and events
- Covid Village Support Group
 - set up/sponsored by PC to help mitigate effects of the pandemic
- Platinum Jubilee
 - funding of festive fizz for the celebrations
 - Cost of Living Crisis/'Warm Haven'
 - support and sponsorship provided for both initiatives to help vulnerable parishioners during the winter

- Foundation Award Certificate

- PC awarded second certificate in 2019 in recognition of meeting all criteria and requirements for operating **lawfully** and in accordance with **best practice.**

 - o introduced during Covid to enable work to continue during lockdown
