Letter from the Reverend Beverley Vincent

Some of us will be welcoming the Christmas season and New Year with a familiar heavy heart. We have so many things to concern us currently and as we hear the Christmas tunes of supermarkets and see the twinkling lights everywhere and try to grasp the joy of Christmas, we might also be reflecting on the uncertainties that next year holds for us.

The political landscape has been chaotic this year which no doubt increases our anxiety about the future. Politics shapes the Christmas story as we know it. Luke's gospel tells us Mary and Joseph travelled to Bethlehem because Quirinius, governor of Syria, was commanded by the Roman Emperor Augustus to conduct a census for the purpose of taxation. In the Gospel read at Christmas time we hear Jesus' credential as a descendant of King David, and the political exile of his ancestors to Babylon in the Old Testament. Then as the Christ child is born the wise men threaten the political order with the news of a newborn king, so that King Herod plans to kill the child. Mary and Joseph flee and live as refugees in neighboring Egypt. Meanwhile, fuelled by the desire to cling to political power, Herod orders all young children in and around Bethlehem to be killed.

The baby Jesus finds his life shaped by the political stage around him from before he leaves the womb. The politics of the world with its competing factions, impact his life from his birth until his final breath on the cross. The Christmas story is about God entering our world, it's about the hope we have that God in the person of Christ came to bring order out of chaos, and peace to all people on earth.

Politics shapes all of our lives. It has profound effects on all lives not just those who are very similar to us but also those who live in very different circumstances. The Bible is clear that our concern should never be just for our own standards of living but rather for those who are particularly vulnerable or in need. Perhaps our Christmas presents this year could simply be acts of kindness, after all these cost nothing and yet are often invaluable.

If you want to add that authentic dimension to Christmas this year, make sure you look out for those who are less fortunate or lonely, be kind, be generous with your time and maybe take a mince pie to those good people who'll spend the day volunteering and serving others in so many ways.

With best wishes for you and your loved ones this Christmas and New Year.



Little Maplestead Volunteer Emergency Telephone System (VETS)

All members of the team will be given basic training, and also a hold all containing some potentially useful equipment, like kneeling pads, torch etc

Nature Notes

The weather, the background to all the natural world, continues to surprise and even alarm us. From the 1st of July until the 18th of October my garden rain gauge recorded just 78 mm of precipitation; from 19th October until 19th November we had 140 mm. Essex is the driest county in England, with an average 500 mm of rain per annum. In the last month we have had more than a quarter of that but the 5 months' total since the beginning of July suggests we might be on course for a 'normal' year. It doesn't feel normal and our November temperatures were very mild indeed. Perhaps reflecting this mild weather was the sight of White Dead-nettle still flowering along roadsides this week and a whole field of rape still yellow.

More typical of the season were mixed flocks of tits moving through woodland canopies and the arrival of winter thrushes from the north. There was a small flock of redwings (right) overhead on the 16th November and then good views of about 20 fieldfares on the 18th, both arriving pretty much at the expected time. Both species are attractive and presage the colder months ahead. They feast on the abundant fruit of



hawthorns, cotoneaster and other berry-bearing plants. Birds like skylarks and yellowhammers are conspicuous by their song in summer but disappear in winter. They don't go anywhere, they just drop out of sight, However, on a mild day and with a little burst of sunshine, a skylark may be persuaded to issue a few notes, even while still on the ground. One such caught my ear a few days ago, but it is just luck if you spot a yellowhammer.



Ravens have been in our area for a couple of years now but remain elusive for such a large bird. I was delighted to spot a pair over Dynes Hall Road last week, my attention being drawn by their deep grokgrok call. They were pursued by a cohort of jackdaws that looked tiny by comparison but fearless, nonetheless. Ravens seem to be spreading over large parts of England that were formerly devoid of the species.

Historically of course they would have been widespread but were driven out by persecution in many areas. I saw a bird over a Surrey heath a couple of weeks ago; when I lived there in the eighties there were none. It's heartening to see birds returning to old haunts, indicating changing attitudes and greater awareness of the value of biodiversity.

Community Playing Field Wins The Lottery



Great Maplestead Parish Council's ambitious £110k Community Playing Field Development Project has received a significant boost by being awarded a £75,000 grant from the National Lottery Community Fund.

More Community Playing Field Wins The Lottery

The project is aimed at revitalising the village playing field, replacing the children's ageing play equipment and providing full access, for people of all abilities, to what is a valuable, and much loved, community amenity.



The thriving village school, which used the playing field as an outdoor learning space during the Covid epidemic and continues with lessons there today, stands to benefit from a new perimeter pathway that can also be used for the pupils' 'Mile-a-Day' challenge.



Since March 2021 an ongoing community fundraising programme has seen donations from individuals, institutions and businesses within in the village reach nearly £37k. Organised social fundraising events, such as a Village Fun(d) Day and Dog Show, quizzes and, in particular, an epic sponsored 1,000-mile bike ride from Land's End to John O'Groats by two residents, which in itself raised over £5k, have been enthusiastically and generously

supported.

Work on improving the community playing field has already begun, with the construction of a Boules court, additional picnic benches and the installation of a new drainage system. The Lottery grant award will now allow work to start on the 'access-for-all' pathway and replacement of the children's play equipment.

Leader of the Development Project Team, Cllr. Simon Last, said: "Receiving this National Lottery Community Fund grant has been a wonderful reward for the tremendous efforts put in by everyone involved in the project. The improvements the grant will now enable us to make to the communityplaying field will a legacy of lasting benefit to residents and visitors to the village for many years to come".

Gardening Corner

I can hardly believe this is the last 'Gardening Corner' of the year – where have the last twelve months gone?

At this time of year, when colour is not so prevalent in our gardens, ornamental grasses make quite a bold statement. We are experiencing a prolonged wet spell; I would therefore recommend planting in the spring when the soil warms up and we have longer days. Once established, grasses give height and movement to the back of a border – or indeed on their own. Look out for Golden Oat Grass [Stipa gigantea], Silver Grass [Miscanthus sinensis] and Tall Moor Grass [Molinia caerulea] – they all grow to between 1.8 and 2 metres.



My recommended plant of the month has to be an ornamental Holly! Ilex [Argentea Marginata], the Silver margined holly or Ilex [Golden King], a lovely shrub with a deep yellow margin to the leaves. If you do plant an ornamental Holly beware – they can grow to 20ft tall or more.

Garlic can be planted any time this month: the old saying goes 'plant on the shortest day and harvest on the longest'. Broad beans can

also be sown outside; plant at least 2 inches deep and keep a look-out for mice, especially if you prefer to plant the seed in pots in the greenhouse. This warning also applies to Sweet Pea seed.

Continue to rake up leaves, composting what you can. If you have a shallow pond it is a good idea to place a net over the top to catch any leaves. The net will also discourage visiting herons who will have an eye on any garden pond as their food becomes shorter in the wild; they seem to find gold fish very tasty...

If you have a greenhouse, cold conservatory or zip-up plant protector, ventilate it for 2 to 3 hours on a warm day; this will help keep mould and disease at bay.

A regular winter job is to check the drainage of pots with bulbs, shrubs and small trees planted in them – if the drainage holes become blocked, the pots can become waterlogged. Also, if you can stand your pots on feet or bricks, this helps maintain free drainage and air circulation.

Omelette Popovers

This recipe is one of the many low-cost, easy to make meals that have been suggested by Great Maplestead's Community Cost of Living Liaison Group: copies can be picked up from the Warm Haven in St Giles' Church.

The recipe offers an alternative way of making omelettes that look very appealing and taste delicious.

Ingredients

Spray oil (to grease)
1 small onion
140g Cheddar cheese
150g frozen peas
6 large eggs

2x15ml fresh chopped chives or 1x5ml dried chives or 1x5ml other herbs Ground black pepper (optional)

1x15ml water

Equipment

Measuring spoons 12-hole muffin tin Sharp knife Chopping board

Grater

Medium mixing bowl Small bowl or large jug Ladle or large spoon

Mixing spoon

Palette knife or spatula

Instructions

Preheat the oven to 180°C/160°C fan or gas mark 4.

Spray the holes of the muffin tin with the spray oil.

Peel and finely chop the onion and divide equally between the holes Put in the oven for 5 minutes.

Weigh and grate the Cheddar cheese. Put the peas into a medium bowl and add the grated cheese.

Wash and chop the herbs and add to the cheese mixture.

Break the eggs into a small bowl and add them to the cheese and peas mix. Add some black pepper to the mixture (to taste) and add the water.

Mix with a fork until the peas have separated from each other and the eggs are well mixed.

Carefully remove the muffin tin from the oven.

Using a ladle, divide the mixture between the 12 holes and with a spoon stir each one to mix in the onion. Return to the oven for 15 minutes or until golden brown on the top.

Allow to cool for 5 minutes then remove the popovers with a spatula.

Notes:

Chopped peppers, mushrooms and red onion make a delicious alternative to the peas – but soften them in a frying pan first!

The popovers are great served with a side salad and some slices of bread.

They will keep for 48 hours in an airtight container in the fridge. Alternatively, freeze them between sheets of baking paper and then transfer them to a plastic bag or container. They can be stored in the freezer for up to a month.
