

Letter from the Rectory

Easter eggs are on sale in supermarkets and you will have taken your decorations down so Christmas must be over – or is it? For the Church, the answer is that it certainly is not. The Christmas season actually lasts for the forty days after the 25th December. Therefore, while you may have finished eating your way through the chocolates on an Advent calendar by Christmas Day it is on that day that the churches' Christmas truly begins. The name for this time of year is Epiphanytide, rather than Christmas, the word Epiphany meaning an awakening or revelation. Christmas being the time when Jesus was revealed to the world. The nativity story tells of the first people to see Jesus – the shepherds and the wise men and the Christmas story continues until the baby Jesus is brought to the temple in Jerusalem. Here a man called Simeon recognised Jesus as the promised messiah and said the words "[that Jesus was] a light for revelation to the Gentiles" – that is the non-Jewish people.

You will see elsewhere in the Magazine references to a church service, we are having in February, called Candlemas. At this service you will be able to enter the church in darkness and then candles will be lit throughout the church to signify the promise that Jesus came to earth at Christmas as our saviour. This should be a special way to end Christmas.

Then a few weeks later we will welcome the pupils of St Giles school in the church at Great Maplestead for an Ash Wednesday service as we move into Lent and start looking forward to Easter. This year Lent will be different for us and the parishes as we will be leaving, with Gay's retirement after nearly eight years – but more about that next month.

So February is a month that we can still sign off with best wishes for the Christmas Season but also with the hope for blessing during Lent.

How Secure is Your Home? Locked Your Door?

We are still experience around the county a number of burglaries that have occurred where either doors are not being locked or not locked correctly. You can reduce the risk of being a victim of burglary by simply taking the time to ensure you understand how your door locks and keeping your property secure.

It may sound obvious, but **do you know how your doors lock?** There are so many types of doors and perhaps your door may have been changed or you may have moved to a new house. Many types of doors can be fitted with a multi-point locking system that as the name suggests has several locking points compared to the older traditional night latch (Yale lock) and mortice lock that each lock in one point.

Most multi-point locking systems have a latch enabling the door to be held closed on the latch upon closing the door and several bolts or hooks that are engaged when you lift the handle. **The Latch** - depending on the type of lock the latch may operate with both the indoor and outdoor handles or just the indoor handle, try your door and see which you have. **The bolts or hooks** these provide the security for your door but only if you lock them in place with the key. **The method** - upon closing the door lift the handle putting all the bolts or hooks in place, on going out lock these all in place with the key, upon locking up indoors use the key as before or the thumb turn if applicable. Until locked in place the hooks or bolts can be released by someone using the outside door handle. If you use a key to operate the lock indoors ensure that you store the key close to the door in case of emergency, but make sure that any keys are out of view from windows and doors.

The Back door - also, we have had some burglaries where the occupants of the house are in their lounge watching TV and in slips the burglar via the insecure rear door, takes what is in that room, the car keys and the car from the drive. Firstly think about your rear boundaries, invest in good fencing and gate(s) 1.8m high, some spiky bushes or climbing plants and fit and use locks to secure the gate. If you need to come and go through the gate use a key operated lock to secure the gate. Secondly if you are not in the room or using the rear door keep it locked, you can also get fairly inexpensive battery operated PIR alarms to alert you if the beam across the door is broken.


The Maplesteads WI

More news from Jan Bettley The Knicker Lady

A few months ago, I wrote in this magazine about my trip to Greece where I helped to deliver aid intended for the migrants who live in the camps on the islands, usually better known for being holiday destinations. I went back in November and I was shocked by the increasingly squalid conditions in the camps which were full to overflowing with whole families living in tents intended for two people. Inside the camps there is limited access to sanitation and water, but outside the camp, even this is lacking. Tents cling to hillsides and at night the areas are infested by rats and snakes. The food available is meagre and women will light fires to try and cook a family meal. Some have died when fires get out of control in an environment which is made of wood and plastic.

As you will have read, on my return to the UK, I asked my WI and a few friends if they would help. I asked them to put one pack of knickers in their shopping trolley, once a month. The idea caught on and developed some impetus, and people responded to my request in this magazine. By November, when I returned to the islands I took 1000 pairs of knickers. They were all sizes and they were all new! That means that women can have two pairs of knickers in a hygiene pack (until they run out).

It is easy to get overwhelmed by the problems one sees on these visits and feel that the situation is hopeless, but the delight of the warehouse staff when they saw my boxes of knickers made me realise that although there were things I couldn't change, we could help to give dignity to the women trapped in the nightmare of the camps.

I met some amazing people on my trips, one restaurant owner helped me to give food to the young teenage boys who hang about on the streets each evening; and when he asked me why I wanted to feed them, I said I was a Christian. To my surprise, he started to open his shirt, but he only wanted to show me a tattoo of the face of Christ which adorned his chest!

Going to Greece with Hope and Aid Direct was a great thing to do, and I hope to continue my association with them. More importantly, I want to have 2000 pairs of knickers by April 2020. Thank you for your generosity to date and please keep going! 
