Letter from the Rectory

Unless you have a birthday or personal anniversary in the month, June is a month in which very little seems to happen on a regular basis. Perhaps that is why the Queen has her official birthday in June.

Even in the church this is usually the case, where the Sundays start being called "Sundays in Ordinary time" or "proper Sundays". This year, however is different, due to the fact that Easter was so late, we see one of the most important days in the church year fall in June.

If you were asked "when is the birthday of the Christian church?", I wonder what your reply would be. Would it be Christmas or Easter? Well the answer is probably Pentecost, historically called Whitsun. Pentecost means fifty days and was the day chosen by the Jewish people to celebrate their harvest festival, the fifty referring to the number of days after Passover,

On this day pilgrims would gather in Jerusalem to make their offerings at the Temple and it was on this day the church could be said to be founded. For at the start of the day around 120 followers of Christ were gathered together and something happened so that by the end of the day, as the bible tells us three thousand had been added to their number. It was at that point that the followers of Christ started to become the church by adding to their number and becoming his servants on earth. Over the next 2,000 years the church developed and changed - adapting itself to changing situations. So it is with the church today, We have to adapt to new situations, it is no exaggeration to say that the changes over the last 40 year or so, though the development of technology have been greater than at any similar time period in history. We have been challenged in the availability of information, in the speed of communication and even in our ideas about what privacy is. Throughout that time the core of the Christian faith has remained constant. What does that mean to you? At the heart of each of our villages are two churches. There is the building but there is also the community of people who are there to "love God and love their neighbour". We are very grateful for the support we are given by those who value the church buildings, such as the newly formed Friends of Pebmarsh church, but we need to add to our number those who can give time for God in worship and growing the church.

So this Pentecost we may not see large numbers added to our churches but please do consider joining us in our services during this "ordinary time" setting aside a little time for God, as a break from busy lives in a busy world.

Recording and marking your property

Any markings on property that links and/or identifies it to its rightful owner may be a deterrent to the thief or burglar with the added potential of the return of the property to its owner. Marked property unlawfully possessed may lead to a conviction and as such marked property is harder for the criminal to dispose of therefore the reward or motivation to the thief is diminished. Also the second hand dealers in our counties work with Essex Police effectively making stolen property "Too Hot to Handle"!

Property marking can take many forms:

- Overt marking that is visible to all like the 'Cesar Data Tag' on commercial plant, engraving, stencil painting of organisation logo to visibly endorsing the property with a post code using an indelible pen or other. An example is 'CREmark' – www.creproducts.co.uk/shop/ default.asp
- Forest marking such as UV pens and Forensic Markers that require a UV light source for the marking to become visible. Reading the marker and/ or reading the microdot can identify its owner. As these are invisible until scanned with a UV light source it is important that stickers are displayed on the marked products. Examples are: UV Pens and Sticker widely available in stores or on the internet. Smart Water www.smartwater.com. Selecta DNA www.selectadna.co.uk
- Asset Recording is another method where you record the details of your property either on your own recording sheet or database (but not kept with the relevant property) or on an 'ISO' accredited database. Your records should include a description of the article and where applicable model, serial and IMEI numbers. To benefit from its deterrent value of this system it is important that stickers are displayed within windows of the premises and on the marked products. Photographs some with a scale can also help in identifying property and can also be uploaded to some databases, for advice on photographing property see "Recording Property" at the bottom of the Essex Police Heritage Watch webpage www.essex.police.uk/advice/essex-watch/heritage-watch/ An example of a property recording database is: Immobilise https://www.immobilise.com/
- Immobilise can be used by members of the public and businesses to register their valued possessions or company assets, and exclusive to Immobilise all registered items and ownership details are viewable on the secure Police national property database the NMPR. This database also links to the publically accessible and second-hand dealer database 'Checkmend' www.checkmend.com/uk/ for restricted searches to establish if an item of property is stolen.

Parish Council annual report 2019

I believe 2018 was a good year for Little Maplestead Parish Council. After the issues of 2017 regarding Parish Council elections, the Parish Council settled down early in 2018 with 5 Councillors and a Parish Clerk.

We have funded the various projects, added to the playground equipment, all within the budget, and managed to balance the accounts. There were a number of projects that were in various stages of completion, and the initial focus was to get these addressed.

We arranged funding and obtained two defibrillators for the Village. Over and above this we organised training sessions and implemented a VETS system for the Village. We also purchased emergency packs for the members of the VETS scheme, so that they would be in a good position to assist anyone anywhere regardless of weather conditions etc. This was completed by around the middle of the year.

I am pleased to say that we have 10 members of the VETS team, and to date we have not been called out.

Proposed Parish Room

The Parochial Church Council outlined their proposal to us to build a Parish Room adjacent to the church, and requested our views on the Planning Application. After some debate and a review of the construction materials The Parish Council agreed to support this application.

This will be an ongoing project during 2019 and into the future. It has yet to be decided what role the Parish Council will have in this project, and this will be an agenda item at most meetings in the year ahead.

Moving Forward

The Parish Room is a large project which will be ongoing for the next year or so.

More Parish Council Annual Report Mobile Phone Mast

The Parish Council are currently looking into the siting and funding of a mobile phone mast, and it is hoped we will have some feedback from the various phone companies within the next few weeks.

We are keen to accelerate this to assist the local farmers who have expressed difficulty in contacting staff during the harvest times due to lack of mobile signal.

Village Gateway Signs

We shall be looking into the costs and feasibility of having village gateway signs at the entrance and exit of the village. I believe this can be useful as a traffic calming measure, and I also believe it gives a sense of ownership which may help to reduce litter etc, and help to make the parishioners proud of their village.

If this goes ahead we will try to obtain a grant to fund them.

Evaluation of the demographic and future of the playing field

We are lucky to have been gifted the playing field, many years ago, and we have also been lucky to obtain grants to update the children's play equipment, but I feel we need to look at the demographic of the village and start to produce a long term plan for the playing field to maximise its use for everyone in the village, and develop as a community space. It is anticipated this will start at the next meeting.

Last but not least I want to thank the Councillors who have worked hard to maintain the infrastructure by not just arranging to get pot holes mended and Footpaths and Bridleways cleared for the benefit of our Parishioners, but also to keep expenditure within budget, and cut costs where they have been able to.

We are very fortunate to have Ann Harris as our Clerk, she puts in many more hours than I am sure she admits to, and keeps us all under control.

Little Maplestead Playing Field

The Council would like to report on the work that is being undertaken in the Playing Field to repair, update and extend the facilities. We have received grants from Essex County Council, Braintree District Council and from a scheme entitled "Bags of Fun" operated by Tesco with which the Council is able to fund the repair and replacement of the surfacing around the double swings, cradle swing and the slide. We have also arranged for an entirely new and different surface (Bonded Rubber Mulch) to be put in place around the rockers. Work will soon commence on repairs to the footpath and also the replacement of the hedge at the Gestingthorpe Road entrance with railings and a new gate. In order to encourage residents and visitors to the Playing Field we have purchased two eight seater picnic benches which will be in place once the concrete bases have been laid, hopefully this month.

The Council is also considering applying for a grant to fund a village information board for the Playing Field to highlight footpaths, walks and points of interest in and around Little Maplestead and the surrounding area.

Auction of Promises


