## HOPE AND AID DIRECT Taking Hope and Aid not Sides

As I sit here in my cosy cottage in Great Maplestead, I cannot help but remember my experiences in Greece just a couple of weeks ago. I flew into Lesvos and joined a group of people from the Charity Hope and Aid Direct who had driven across Europe from Essex in two 7.5 ton trucks and one 40 foot articulated lorry. They are all volunteers, giving up time and income to deliver aid to the immigrant camps on Lesvos and Chios islands as well as around Athens.

## Your Mobile phone - Cybercrime and SMISHING

**Smishing** -- using smart phone texts to phish for victims' confidential information -- is soaring, and it's more dangerous than email phishing.

This type of phishing, better known as "smishing," has been around for years but because consumers have wised-up to email tricks and, in fact, are using email less and less for simple messages, scammers have switched their focus to SMS texts to target their victims.

The text usually contains a link that downloads malware, which steals as much data as it can find. And therein lies the threat:

Your smartphone knows a lot more about you than your PC, so an installed piece of malware might steal the phone numbers in your contact list and spread the virus in hopes to exponentially multiply. Even important bits of personal data, like banking credentials or your tracking location, can be at risk.

Scammers are also using texts to pose as tax authorities. The tactic creates a false sense of realism because many people don't realise that text messages can be a threat. They say that the user is due a tax refund or needs to provide more information," she explains. Basically, they try to get users' information, and that can be used for stealing their money.

#### What to Do

The best thing you can do to avoid falling victim is to never click on a link inside a text message.

Certainly, you should never respond to a request for a password or other confidential information. Instead, visit the real website of the organisation that seems to be asking and check if it's a genuine request.

You should also use extreme caution even if the message asks you to send the word "Stop" unless you're 100% sure that it's genuine. Sending a "Stop" message may not land you in immediate trouble but it signals to a phishing scammer that there's a bite on the line.

In fact, for the same reason, you should never reply to text messages from someone you don't know.

Block the sender if you can. But otherwise, just delete the message, and don't share your cell phone number on social media.

In addition, it's wise to install an anti-malware app on your phone.

## The Maplesteads WI Meeting April 2019

President Carol Brownlie welcomed everyone, including visitors and our speaker Mr Jim Davis, to our meeting on Thursday April 4th 2019. Secretary Janice Chaplin read the minutes of the previous meeting which were signed as correct and birthday flowers were presented.

Carol then asked Jane Stone, Programme Co-ordinator to introduce our speaker, Mr Jim Davis, a local historian, with his talk on The History of the Maplesteads. Unfortunately Mr Davis thought he had spoken to us about the history of the Maplesteads before so changed his talk to the history of Halstead and its development from a small rural town to a considerable manufacturing town, due in large part to the famous Courtauld family. Who knew that at one time Halstead had 14 huge factory chimneys! Carol gave the vote of thanks. #### **Churchyard Tidy-up**



Denise took this photo of the group at the church on the 6 April when they tidied up the churchyard and the ashes plot. It all looks so much better. Great community spirit, work and cake and fellowship - the community of Great Maplestead at work together. Big thank you to them all.



The camps are the holding points for people who have fled war in the hope of finding a peaceful life. They have come from Syria, Iraq, Afghanistan and other places that we have learned to associate with barrel bombs and total destruction. They do not know if they will ever be allowed to leave the camp but they wait in patience every day.

The camps are guarded by the Greek army and access is strictly controlled. Conditions inside are basic at best. Families are allotted a space about the size of a four man tent. If they are lucky it is just for them, but often they have to share with other families. Predation against women is common although some men try to provide a security system.

I spent my time moving sorting, loading and unloading hundreds of banana boxes full of aid donated by kind people here. There were hundreds of boxes and I moved some of them so often that sometimes felt I knew each one personally. But the hard physical work was not what has stayed with me. What I remember are the charities and people who work there every day, every week, every month. Hope and Aid Direct support theses amazing groups which ensures the aid taken actually gets to the migrants. We gave clothes to the people who, anytime day or night, give clothes, hot drinks and a welcome to the wet and shocked migrants as they scramble ashore from flimsy and overcrowded rubber boats. We delivered sacks of pasta and tins of beans and lentils to an amazing restaurant owner who feeds 1000 migrants each day. We took children's clothes to a centre set up by a refugee who has gained the right to stay in Greece. He rents a warehouse space and provides a place of safety for women and children. Here young volunteers are play leaders and the children have space to learn, develop and be part of a community. Mothers can talk and rest in the space where no man can enter. Security is provided by male residents of the camp, but they guard the perimeter, never entering.

We were able to visit a school based in a house in a quite isolated setting, where young adults can learn a European language. There is a waiting list to study there. Student walk for 30 minutes each way in any weather. If they cut a class, their place goes to the next on the list. They do not miss classes.

Another centre has grown out of a group of sheds, and now has a school called the Peace School (self built from anything available) a tailors shop, a library in an old caravan and a hairdressers. Here is a shop and canteen, all manned by people from the camp. They have a bank with their own currency which is all that can be used on site. Here young people can mix, play sports, be part of a team and develop a sense of self in a secure environment.

On Saturday 13th April, 10 stall holders welcomed visitors to the Gestingthorpe Spring Craft Fair in the village hall. There was a good selection with painting, decoupage, writing, glass decorations, cards, pottery and needle felting as well as a great cake stall and book/dvd table.

The weather stayed fine for most of the day and we had a steady flow of visitors who made purchases or enjoyed the hospitality from the kitchen.

#### Parish Room Update

After no progress to report in the last few months, the Parochial Church Council are pleased to confirm Historic England have provided their support for the proposed parish room. In addition, letters of support from the Parish Council, Robin King the Archdeacon, Rev'd Gay Ellis our Vicar, the Friends of the Round Church and St John's who have an historical connection with the church, have been received.

The survey of the village is now completed and we are pleased to say there is overwhelming support for the proposal. In total 110 people expressed their support, which equates to 96% of those canvassed, or to put it another way, 54% of the residents who are eligible to vote are in support.

On the 9 April, a ground survey of the proposed location of the Parish Room was conducted using Ground Penetrating Radar. The survey identified the existing drain from the toilet and a small linear feature on the western boundary showing the characteristics of a thin pipe or cable. There was also an indication of potentially structured features on the southern edge of the survey plot. However, in the immediate area of the location of the parish room, the survey showed no ground disturbances.

The PCC are therefore very pleased to announce that they are now ready to make a formal planning application.

One of the aims of the project is to bring the community together and the PCC would like to thank everyone who has offered their help with securing funding, with its construction or who has put forward ideas for additional uses of the parish room. It's really encouraging that so many of you have been supportive of the proposal.

I saw and learned so much but have one image I cannot shake off. There is a line of 500 women, all queuing for a serving of boiled macaroni, a raw egg, flatbread and an orange. This would be supper for their family in a 4 foot by 8 foot cardboard box. They were strong and patient. They kept their children clean and tidy. Their own clothes were second hand from someone in the UK, (including their underwear!), yet somehow, they still had self respect, A few years ago, they had a home and a kitchen, maybe like the one where I am typing this. War took it away from them, but they stand tall in the food queue. They amaze me! I will go back.
