Littering – help us stamp it out!

Litterers are on the loose!

Littering and fly-tipping are anti-social, inconsiderate acts that have a detrimental, destructive impact on the environment in which we all live.

These activities are now becoming a **serious problem** for **Great Maplestead** – one that's both unpleasant and time-consuming to deal with.

Over the past few months the **Parish Council** has been made aware not only of an **increasing amount of roadside litter** apparently discarded from cars, but also what appears to be **deliberate acts of bulk rubbish fly-tipping.**

A recent Task Force litter-pick netted a wheelie-bin full of landfill items, five sacks of re-cycleables and a tubful of bottles – by far the largest amount of rubbish collected in any previous clean-up.

Hedingham Road, closely followed by Monks Lodge Road, were the worst areas for sheer volume of litter, with food wrappers and drinks cans being

the main items carelessly discarded.

A cache of cans, wrappers and tyres was discovered later fly-tipped near the **Hedingham / Alderford Farm Road** junction, with more on the track up to **Rangers Hall**.



The standard penalty for a littering offence is £75, although persistent offenders can be fined up to £2,500.

It's Time for Action...

Cuts to Local Authority budgets mean that the initiative to tackle this growing problem will need to be actioned and implemented

at Parish level.

The initiative will not just be about clearing up after fly-tippers and litterers; it will also be about actively helping to reduce the incidence of littering, asking all residents to both look out for and report offenders, enabling them to be traced, charged and fined.

Braintree District Council's Environmental Officer is of the opinion that getting parishioners involved in monitoring and reporting littering and other flytipping activities across the Parish will achieve tangible results.

The Parish Council will, as a result, shortly be introducing an Anti-Littering and Fly-tipping Campaign. This will give everyone the opportunity to report such incidents to



the authorities both anonymously and safely.



The aim of the **Campaign** is not only to **create local awareness** of the true scale of the littering problem but also to ensure that potential perpetrators appreciate that there will

be a **greater risk of prosecution** should they litter or fly-tip within the **Parish** boundaries.

This Campaign is intended to help you help Great Maplestead become a pleasant, and litter-free, place to live once again.



Reporting Offenders...

The Parish Council have developed a simple form to allow you easily to record and report instances of littering or fly-tipping.

Your information, along with any additional details you can provide, such as photo evidence, will then be forwarded to **Braintree District Council** for follow-up action.

Reinforcing the Message...

The Anti-Littering and Fly-tipping Campaign will be supported by a range of actions to increase awareness and involvement.

There will be prominently positioned 'This is a Litter Watch Area' warning signs and 'No Flytipping' reminders on the bottle bank.

It is also planned to involve the **local press**, **getting the message out** to neighbouring communities. This will ensure that **potential offenders** are fully aware there is a reasonable chance of them **being traced**, **charged and fined** due to the **Council's** proactive stance in addressing the **Parish's** littering issues.

If successful, it is hoped that the Campaign will act as an exemplar that other Parishes may wish to adopt.
