Local Bus Services are Facing the Axe – Have Your Say...

Be sure to share your views...

Buses serving Great Maplestead and many surrounding villages are under threat of being axed when the current operator contracts expire in September 2017.



Essex CC has undertaken a thorough review of the financial support for its currently funded local bus services across the County. It is now running a **Public Consultation** on

routes it subsidises, due to concerns about the cost to the taxpayer.

ECC's maximum subsidy allowance is $\pm 5/$ passenger – on some routes the actual cost is over ± 10 /passenger, which is unsustainable in the longer term.

Among the services under review, it is being proposed that **Regal Buses 11, 12** and **13** from Halstead to Sudbury – the ones directly affecting **Great Maplestead** – be withdrawn and replaced by a **Demand Responsive Transport** system, where passengers book journeys with the operators in advance.

Naturally, there are concerns that such a system will not be as suitable or convenient for many elderly residents, seriously reducing their independence; it could also result in greater car numbers on rural roads.

Bus users are therefore being encouraged to share their views on these proposals and participate in the Consultation by completing and submitting the one-page questionnaire, hard copies of which are available in St Giles' Church.

The Public Consultation closes on the 28th September, so make sure your views about the proposed changes to this community amenity are properly taken into account.

Bottling things up...

To minimise noise and undue disturbance to people living near the Bottle Bank...

...please deposit your bottles there only between **8.00am** and **8.00pm**. If the bank is full, **do not fly-tip** – if necessary, use an alternative site.

Waste not – want not...

Difficulties are being caused by the illegal dumping of construction and DIY waste at Essex recycling centres.



In order to address this problem **Braintree Recycling Centre** will, from the **31st October**, be placing strict limits on the amount of this sort of waste that it will accept.

Construction and DIY waste is considered to be any material resulting from building or demolition work in a home or garden. There is no duty on a local authority to accept or dispose of this sort of waste from residential properties.

From the end of October **BRC's** acceptance of construction and DIY waste materials will be subject to the following per household limits:

In any 28-day period:

- three wheelbarrow loads (one car boot full) of soil and hardcore
- one wheelbarrow load of tiles

and, in any six-month period:

- three large ceramic items e.g. toilet or wash basin
- one uPVC or wooden window frame
- one uPVC or wooden external door
- three wooden internal doors
- any elements of a built-in kitchen

If you are unsure whether the **Recycling Centre** will take your waste, or whether you will need to rent a skip for larger home improvement projects after 31 October, you can check more details at http://www.recycleforessex.com/.

- 16/01348/FUL Repairs to walls below floor level in matching materials and techniques.
 Walnut Tree Cottage, Church St.
