# **Letter from the Rectory**

Saint Paul's Church in Harlow, where both Gay & Nick worshiped before Gay's ordination, contains one of the most striking images of Christ that you can find. It is a large mosaic by the renowned artist John Piper. To the side of the mosaic on the choir gallery there are three crests, one of the Royal Crest, one of the crest of the Town Council but the third has the word "members one of another" and is the crest of Harlow Development Corporation which was the organisation set up to construct the new town. Although a secular organisation the Corporation chose as its motto a phrase from the bible. For "members one of another" is part of St Paul's description of what it means to be a member of the church.

Each year the Church of England issues statistics showing the membership of the church, but this term is wrong. The Church of England is one of the few organisations of which every person in a parish is a member of. If you live within a parish you have the right to be buried in the churchyard (presuming that it is not full), be married in your parish church and have your children baptised. You can also attend church for any public service, there is no need to sign up, or even contribute any money, aside from fees set nationally for weddings and funerals. You can also call on your local Vicar if needed.

Those church membership figures do not reflect this, they are based on the number of people attending church and the number on the church's Electoral Roll. This roll is just what is says: it gives you the right to take part in the way the church is run. Being on the roll gives you the right to attend the churches annual meeting and to stand for election as a member of the church council. You do not need to put your name on the roll for any other reason.

Every six years the church prepares a new roll, which means that everyone who wishes to be on the roll has to fill in a new form. Elsewhere in the magazine the dates of the revision are shown. Please do consider how you want to be a member of the church. Perhaps attend more services, make regular financial contribution to the running costs, even help out with jobs in the church. Or take your involvement a step further and think about joining the roll to vote in church elections and becoming a member of the Church Council.

### **Cold Calling Intruder Alarm Companies**

Considering an intruder alarm? Think twice before you consider taking an offer up from a cold calling intruder alarm company. Quite often they will use high pressure sales tactics, make you an offer that appears to be too good to be true, somewhere may be concealed charges. If you are told the alarm goes through direct to the police then "alarm bells" should ring, the police do not monitor intruder alarms, they go to a commercial central monitoring station who contact police on a confirmed activation and if a certain criteria is fulfilled and resources are available then police attend.

With any cold callers, stop, give yourself time to think about what is being offered, do a little research before coming to a decision, speak to friends or family, don't be rushed. Remember "if it appears too good to be true invariable it is" and "you get nothing for nothing". If you need something done or purchased speak to neighbours and friends and take on a trader by personal recommendation, or Trading Standards "Buy with Confidence" scheme www.buywithconfidence.gov.uk or call 0345 404 0506.

Gone are the days when an alarm was an indication you have something to steal, there are so many out there now, and it has been proven that having an intruder alarm is a strong deterrent to burglars. Self-install or installed system, wired or wireless, bells only or self-monitored or call centre monitored, there are pros, cons and financial implications to each. If you go with an installed system we recommend that you use NSI www.nsi.co.uk or SSAIB www.ssaib.co.uk accredited companies (some are also "Buy with Confidence" vetted for extra peace of mind), and get at least three quotes to compare like for like.

Unlike a conventional bus, the F315 bus service requires some passengers to pre-book their seat and register as a customer at least two hours in advance of travel using either bookings@essexandsuffolkdart.co.uk or 01621 874411. ### **Pebmarsh Parish Council**

Late last year representatives of the Parish Council (Jackie Tufnell and the Parish Clerk, Pippa Potter) had a very constructive and lengthy meeting in the village with three representatives of Essex Highways to discuss and examine road safety issues in the village.

The first was that, with the help and support of David Finch (head of Essex CC), the Parish Council have been pressing for yellow zig-zag lines outside the school and more prominent signs, including "20's Plenty" signs. They told us this was in hand.

Next , they agreed that the signage leading up to the bridge over the Peb in the middle of the village (where traffic is - in theory- one way only, but many people go far too fast and ignore the priority signs) was unsatisfactory and they will consider putting new and clearer signage there. We also discussed the perils of exiting Mill Lane, because of the speed with which cars come up the hill past the church, often in the middle of the road; they suggested that the exit lines on the road should be moved further out. Finally the dangers of the junction of Oak Road and Birchleys Road at the top of the village were discussed . There is no Give Way sign on Birchleys Road and the road markings have all but disappeared.

How long this is going to take is, I'm afraid, anyone's guess but each of these points is now "in the system" and all we can do is keep pressing , which we will do.

On another subject the Parish Council at its last meeting decided to try and re-issue the Guide to the Footpaths of Pebmarsh (of which there are many). The last version of this Guide was produced over 20 years ago , and many in the village therefore don't have it. Once this is available again, copies will be available in the Pub and the new local Convenience Store which has recently opened in Cross End (and which is a very welcome addition to the facilities of the village along with the hair and beauty salon next to it)."
