Your cover needs you.

More importantly, particularly for Pebmarsh, please read the letter below from our Vicar the Rev'd Gay Ellis and the Pebmarsh article on defibrillators.





Dear residents of Pebmarsh, I have never written an article like this before but now find that I need to. I think Pebmarsh is a lovely parish; it has a really good community feel to it and the people are friendly and caring. You have done a wonderful job in getting the Community Pub up and running, and it has made a lot of difference to the lives of both local people and those who visit our parish. I now need to ask for your help. The church is a lovely old building and is a part of the village history, but it is also part of the history of many of the families who have, or do live in Pebmarsh, evoking memories of being there for weddings or funerals, or baptisms. Perhaps people in your family are shown in the wedding, baptism or funeral registers. If I asked you how much it costs to run the church weekly, I wonder what you would say? The church has housekeeping costs like any other building in the village. The cost of running the church is approximately £1,140 per month, but our monthly income is only approximately £560.

You don't have to be a mathematician to realise we don't have enough income to pay our normal bills, heating, insurance, alarms, ministry etc let alone maintain the building which we do by trying to get grants.

What I am asking is, could you as people living in the village give a standing order for a pound or two per week or a small amount per month. You don't have to come to church to support the church. We have economised as much as we can. If we could all give the cost of a drink in the pub, whatever your taste is, beer or wine, or even a soft drink, per week, we could pay our bills without this terrible worry. Can you help? I do hope you can? I do hope so, thank you for reading this article. God bless.

We shall also be having displays of local food and drink producers and examples of what they do.

So it is going to be a week-end of wonderful flowers with 27 wonderful large arrangements displayed in our unique round church, plus all the other events mentioned above. People are working hard to produce this events and NFU and local businesses are helping alongside the army of wonderful flower arrangers who are planning and preparing their own arrangements.



There will also be the usual teams of people doing the refreshments, putting up the tents, moving the furniture, putting up the advertising posters. Can you also promote this to lots of other people. In August we shall have leaflets in church, so if you are member of any group or know where any could be displayed, please do pop into church and take a leaflet and please do put the date in your own diaries as we need to see you there if at all possible.

Summer Crime Prevention Advice

During the summer months we see a rise in the number of "Creeper Burglaries" where burglars take advantage of open gates, and windows and doors left open for ventilation or that you forgot to close. Check the simple things:-

- 1. **Parked cars** Don't leave property on display in the car. Are the windows shut and doors locked (don't assume that by pressing the button on the remote it is locked, try the handle too)?
- 2. Don't leave unattended pedal cycles insecure and out the front.
- 3. Side gate shut and locked, sheds and garages secure?
- 4. **Doors** closed and locked? Don't forget on that with a PVCu multilocking door you may have lifted the handle but until you turn the key or thumb turn on the inside you have not locked all the locks in place.
- 5. **Windows** lift the blinds or open the curtains and check they are closed, the sun may have been on the TV and it was hot, so they were drawn with the window open. Make sure in case of fire that keys to windows and doors are readily accessible to occupants but not in view of possible burglars.
- 6. If you have an **intruder alarm** activate when going out and activate the zone for the unoccupied area whilst in.
- 7. **Car keys** don't take them to bed with you, where possible leave them in noisy drawer/location. Keep the keyless fob in a "Faraday" bag.
- 8. If you do hear a suspicious noise in the house that you are not happy with **dial 999** and make a noise, shout out, it could cause any intruder to flee, they may not have known you were home, remember your life is more important than your property.
- 9. Stopping for lunch, a drink or a cuppa whilst out, soaking up the sun, or going down to the sea, don't drop your guard. If you don't pay attention to your camera, mobile phone, sunglasses, purse or wallet and a thief sees this they will steal it.
- 10. **Social Media** When using "Facebook" or other social media be wary of announcing to the world that you are away and your house is empty. Make sure your profile does not contain private information that would identify you or your address to a stranger.

Last bit of advice - Going on holiday? Cancel the milk and newspaper deliveries and look after each other, get a neighbour or friend to keep an eye on your property, ensure neighbours have contact numbers for a key

holder and where possible let them park their car on your drive. Basically if you create the illusion that your house is occupied (TV simulator, lights and radio on timers) it is less likely to be broken into.

Rufus moved to 8 Stone Cottages, Great Maplestead in December 1978, and I joined him there in 1985 and we were married in 1990 at St Giles Church. We then moved just down the road to a new bungalow, Hopgrounds, where we lived until 2010 when I took up my current post of Priest in Charge at the The Box River Benefice, halfway between Sudbury and Hadleigh.

During our very happy years in Great Maplestead we made many lasting friendships. Rufus was a member of the Task Force, helping out around the village. He was also for a time on the Parish Council and took on the role of tree warden. He introduced a Churchyard Management Plan which was so commended that it was given as an example of good practice in a small publication on managing churchyards for conservation. Rufus was also instrumental in drawing to the attention of former Kew botanist, Edgar Milne-Redhead, the presence throughout the village and on the verge closest to Long Fen, of what were later confirmed to be native Grape Hyacinth (smaller and darker than the garden ones).

For myself, I became churchwarden, working happily with John Martin, and then trained to become Lay Reader to the benefice. Since moving to Boxford, Rufus has undertaken a great deal of church administration as well as running our household and much else. The time has now come for us to retire and we will be moving to Reepham in North Norfolk in August this year.

*Make sure you visit the Ploughing completion at Maplestead Hall on Saturday (opposite the church) The 999 emergency services will not contact the Pebmarsh VETS on your behalf as their policies do not allow that at present. That may change in time but is not the case now for our area. Do not rely on the 999 emergency services to contact the Pebmarsh VETS in the event of you calling them.

Always contact the 999 emergencies services first by dialling 999 and where possible contact the Pebmarsh VETS to respond as well. Whilst waiting for the first responder to arrive administer CPR to the person.

CPR

To administer CPR follow the below simple steps:

- 1. Check for a pulse
- 2. Tilt the patient's head back and lift the chin
- 3. Pinch the nose and cover the patient's mouth with your mouth and breathe in life-giving air
- 4. If no pulse, start giving 30 compressions by pumping the chest. Put the heel of one hand on the centre of their chest and interlock your fingers. Begin to pump the chest hard and fast Don't worry about pressing down too hard as the chest needs to go down by at least 5cm for CPR to be effective
- 5. Give two rescue breaths after every 30 compressions

Once you have a defibrillator, quickly open it, switch it on and listen to the verbal instructions that will explain exactly what you need to do. If possible do not stop CPR whilst you open and listen to the instructions. AEDs can be used on anyone over the age of one. The machine will analyse the patient's condition automatically, providing you with verbal information and instructions on how to use the machine.

Using a Defibrillator

- 1. Take the pads from the sealed pack and remove or cut through any clothing on the patient's chest and wipe away any sweat.
- 2. Remove the backing paper and attach the pads to their chest.
- 3. Place one pad on their upper right side, just below their collarbone as shown on the pad and then place the second on their left side, below the armpit. The pads must be positioned lengthways with the long side in line with the length of their body.
- 4. As soon as you have done this, the AED will begin to check the patient's heart rhythm. Make sure that you or anyone else near to the patient is not touching them and continue to follow the verbal instructions until help arrives.
- 5. If the patient becomes responsive place them in the recovery position but leave the AED attached in case further shock is required.

The Pebmarsh VETS are the group of volunteers who respond to an emergency call to 01787 852300 requesting local assistance in the event of a cardiac arrest. They are trained to use a defibrillator and will assist until the arrival of the 999 emergency services, which must be contacted first in the event of an incident. The VETS volunteers will only respond in the event of being called out via 01787 852300. To activate a call out from the Pebmarsh VETS you must dial 01787 852300. Your call will be then routed through ten households in and around Pebmarsh on the VETS system and accepted by the first Pebmarsh VETS volunteer able to respond and attend.
